Many timbers have been renewed, the treadmill is connected by an axle-beam with a reel over the well. In 1975 it was still in good repair and working condition. A rare example and outstanding. The building houses a well, c120ft deep, and a donkey wheel (treadmill) which is still in perfect working order. A watching brief for footings for a new barn found no features or finds. The owner said that in the past all finds have been at the other side of the farm in what is now the garden. Site Assessment = A rare example and outstanding.
