Ugley is noted as Ugley (or Oakley) According to Mr Thresh's report of 1905, p53, the village except for some houses at Patmore End, is supplied by wells 20-30ft deep.

Well Series Record? Ugley Green. Sunk for Mr J. E. Waithman's 1909 Made and commission by C Isler and Co. 165ft deep borehole. Lined with 10 ft of 5in tubes from 5 feet down; 90 ft of 4 in tubes from 3 ft down. Water level 111ft down. Supply 360 gallons an hour. Through clay and sand and into chalk and flints.

Well or borehole description: Borehole (see above)

Water-raising mechanism: Lift pump

Significant features: **Description:** Cast iron C19 lift hand pump in typical position on village green.
Lower Body: banded cast iron
Upper Body: moulded and banded cast iron
Spout: Located on the lower body with bucket hook
Handle: Located on the rear with knop weight
Cap: fluted with pineapple finial
Makers mark: sunk by C Isler in 1909

Working Order/Infilled/Disused: Not in working order

Ugley: The following pumps are recorded in Whitaker, W & Thresh, J (1916) Memoirs of the Geological Society England and Wales. The Water Supply of Essex from underground sources, Great Britain, Jas Truscott & Son

These Wells and pumps are still to be confirmed to the Author, they come from records made in 1916, so it might be that they no longer exist. Many though are on private property and the Author would welcome confirmation of their existence and to record them.

UGL02: Wade Hall, less than a mile s/w of the church.

Well sunk in 1875 by G Ingold. Well shaft throughout to 100ft deep through clay to chalk

UGL03: Ugley Hall, Ugley Green, Ugley CM22 6JB

Work done to the well/bore in 1929 by R H Nichols, Herts, probably to an Old well, which required lowering or borehole.

UGL04: Dellows, Ugley Green, Ugley CM22 6HN

Well /borehole sunk in 1909 by C Isler, ltd, Artesian works, bear lane, Southwark street, London SE1

UGL05: Chequers Inn, Ugley, CM22 6HZ

This well was sunk by G Ingold and is known to be 100ft deep, noted with handpump. (1916)

UGL06: Cottage, Vicarage Lane, Ugley CM22 6HU

Well unknown date noted as having bucket and winch and partly filled-in in 1965 records

UGL07: The Vicarage, Ugley

Well sunk by G Ingold in c19, 95 ft deep.
